**John Howard Payne** (9 June 1791 - 10 April 1852) was an American actor and playwright. He is today most remembered as the author of "Home Sweet Home", **a song he wrote in 1822.** 

After spending nearly twenty years in Europe, Payne returned to the United States,

In 1842 John Payne was **appointed by President Tyler** to be the **American consul at Tunis** in Africa. Payne **died in Tunis in 1852.**
