Finding Yourself in the Psalms Psalm 130 **"A Psalm for Sinners."**

One of 7 penitential psalms (6, 32, 38, 51, 102, 130, 143) Follows a lament psalm (129):

"When we have overcome the trials which arise from man, we are the better prepared to meet those sharper sorrows which arise out of our matters towards God" *Spurgeon*.

Similarity with Hezekiah's song after he had been healed from his illness. Isaiah 38:9, 13, 17

OUTLINE: 8 verses 8 cries to God 2 main divisions with two sub divisions each

Psalm 130 (NIV)

1 A song of ascents.

Out of the depths I cry to you, O LORD; 2 O Lord, hear my voice. Let your ears be attentive to my cry for mercy.

3 If you, O LORD, kept a record of sins, O Lord, who could stand? 4 But with you there is forgiveness; therefore you are feared.

5 I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in his word I put my hope. 6 My soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen wait for the morning, more than watchmen wait for the morning.

7 O Israel, put your hope in the LORD, for with the LORD is unfailing love and with him is full redemption. 8 He himself will redeem Israel from all their sins.

- 1. **Out of the depths.**
 - a. *Realization of sin*
 - b. Brokenness. Psl 32: 3 "When I kept silent my bones wasted away."
 - "Deep places beget deep devotion" (Spurgeon)
- 2. O LORD, hear my voice."
 - a. Knows God will hear him

- b. Verbal prayer important. Praying with others important.
- c. DOESN'T SAY **"O Lord, ANSWER my prayer."** More important that God hear than that he answer.
- B. Joyful consolation. 3-4
 - 1. KJV "If thou LORD shoulds't mark iniquity, who shall stand?"
 - 2. Our sin overwhelmed us. Ps 38:4; 40:12
 - 3. Isa 38:17 "Sins behind your back."
 - 4. Psa 103:12 "as far as the east is separated from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us"
 - 5. "With you there is forgiveness." God's mercy prompts
 - a. OBEDIENCE
 - b. WORSHIP

 - A. Trustful expectation. 5-6
 - 1. WAITING. (Worship. Service. Patience. Learning.)
 - "In His Word." God has spoken. Don't look for new revelation. EX
 20!
 - 3. A Watchman.
 - B. Stirring exhortation. 7-8
 - 1. God can be trusted.
 - 2. Hesed. Loyal love.
 - 3. The promise of forgiveness.
