1 John 2:1-2 "My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anybody does sin, we have one who speaks to the Father in our defense—Jesus Christ, the Righteous One."

 - A. Conflict. 143:3
 - 1. The BACKGROUND is David's sin with Bathsheba, and his flight from Absalom. **143:1-2**
 - 2. (2 Samuel 15:13-14, 25-26, 30-31)
 - 3. (2 Samuel 15:30) "But David continued up the Mount of Olives, weeping as he went; his head was covered and he was barefoot. All the people with him covered their heads too and were weeping as they went up."
 - B. Sorrow. 143:4
 - C. Humility. 143:5-6 **HUMBLED by GOD!**
 - 1. (Proverbs 16:18) "Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall."
 - 2. (Proverbs 29:23) "A man's pride brings him low, but a man of lowly spirit gains honor."
 - 3. (Psalm 138:6) "Though the Lord is on high, he looks upon the lowly, but the proud he knows from afar."
 - 4. (Matthew 23:12) "For whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted."
 - 5. (Isaiah 2:11-12) "The eyes of the arrogant man will be humbled and the pride of men brought low; the Lord alone will be exalted in that day. The Lord Almighty has a day in store for all the proud and lofty, for all that is exalted (and they will be humbled),"
