- 1. 90:1-2 God is eternal
- 2. 90:3 Man is mortal (our origin matter)

- 4. 90:5-6 Man constantly passes away
- B. Looking at us
 - 1. 90:7 God is HOLY.
 - a. Hebrews 12:14 (NIV)¹⁴ Make every effort to live in peace with all men and to be holy; without holiness no one will see the Lord.
 - b. 1 Peter 1:14-16 (NIV)¹⁴ As obedient children, do not conform to the evil desires you had when you lived in ignorance. ¹⁵ But just as he who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; ¹⁶ for it is written: "Be holy, because I am holy."
