# Why Revelation?

This final book of the canon is the consummation of all things. God wins!! For 7,000 years, sin has been a part of the human fabric and has caused havoc even in creation (Romans 8:22). The book of Revelation not only speaks of the judgment God reigning down on His creation, but this book gives us believers a glimpse of what our future holds, and >the life that God intended from the very beginning of time.

Revelation- (Apa- co- Lip- see) ἀποκάλυψις to cause something to be fully known— 'to reveal, to disclose, to make fully known, revelation.'

# 4 Methods of Interpretation

| Allegorical                      | This would be something like a bedtime story, a fairy Tale, legend or myth.  More along the lines of a fable.  |
|----------------------------------|--|
| Preterist                        | This approach would say that the events of Revelation happened in 70 A.D.  |
| Historical                       | This approach uses symbols in Revelation as pictures of the total Church Age. To this group, Revelation is history book of the past.   |
| Futuristic/ Literal-<br>FBC View | This approach takes the book of Revelation as it reads in the book. When symbols are used it is interpreted by the Word of God. The events of Revelation are literal and future. |

### **Eschatology Terms**



<u>Tribulation</u>- 7-year event that will happen after the Rapture and will end at Jesus 2<sup>nd</sup> coming.



- Pre Trib- FBC View- | Thess 1;9; | Thess 5:10
- •Mid Trib- Jesus will come mid Trib for His church
- Post Trib- The church will go through Trib and Jesus will come for us.



Millennial Kingdom- A literal 1,000-year reign of Christ here on earth.




- Pre-Millennial FBC View-
  - •We will rule and reign with Christ in HIs Kingdom for 1000 years.
- Post Millennial-
  - •They believe that "1,000 years" simply means "a long period of time."
  - Christ will return after Christians (not Christ Himself) have established the kingdom on this earth.
  - •Those who hold to postmillennialism believe that this world will become better and better

#### • A Millennial-

- •An amillennialist sees the 1,000 years as spiritual and non-literal- No literal Kingdom
- •the amil position sees the millennium as "realized," or better explained as "millennium now."
- •Amillennialism sees the first coming of Christ as the inauguration of the kingdom, and His return as the consummation of the kingdom.


Let's look at verse 19

- 7. Laodicea- The Lukewarm Church-Rev 3:14-22


## Closing
